Jeff Gilmore is an Emerging Services Operations Lead at Facebook. His team of 60+ oversee the day-to-day operations of M, a cutting edge artificial intelligence project for Facebook Messenger. Jeff is passionate about veteran causes and veteran employment. Jeff leads the Veterans Employee Resource Group at Facebook. He is also a Major in the US Air Force Reserves as a C-17 pilot and liaison at DIUx. While on active duty, he served 10 years as a C-21 Learjet and C-17 instructor pilot. He deployed in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom and Horn of Africa operations.

Jeff was also a key contributor to the Air Force's first successful Electronic Flight Bag program. The initiative won the 2012 Air Force Chief of Staff Team Excellence Award. Jeff also co-invented the Air Mobility Command's Digital Tactics Binder, a centralized data-distribution product used daily by mobility aircrews to rapidly disseminate classified documents for worldwide contingency operations, especially in combat environments like Iraq and Afghanistan. The Digital Tactics Binder provides time critical tactical awareness and survivability for aircrews in combat environments. Jeff is married to his wife Lindsey and has a 10 month old daughter Natalie.

Anne Meree Craig is the wife of a US Army Ranger Veteran. She served as a civil servant deploying around the world in direct strategic and operational support to the Department of Defense and Intelligence Agencies. Anne Meree co-founded The COMMIT Foundation in order to help others do the same. She connects the dots to help in creating serendipity for our veterans and works to grow the enduring relationships necessary to enable real success.

An entrepreneur, she founded a consulting business aimed at relationship navigation, strategy development, and research. She has served as the Chief Administrative Officer at McChrystal Group and as the Director of Strategic Initiatives at Berico Technologies. Prior to purchasing the farm, Paul served for 20 years in the United States Air Force as an aircraft maintenance officer on F-15, F-16, F-22, and F-117 aircrafts. He retired in 2013 with the rank of Lieutenant Colonel. Paul has a Bachelor of Science from Montana State University and a Masters of Business Administration from Webster University. He is an avid sportsman and enjoys participating in halfmarathons.

Matt Gangloff is a veteran, UM Alumni, entrepreneur and owner of Enlyten Lab Float Center in Missoula. Matt was the first intern at the Blackstone LaunchPad and Enlyten was the first LaunchPad business to take 1st place at the John Ruffato **Business Plan Competition** at UM's School of Business Administration. Enlyten Lab is a spa featuring sensory deprivation as a wellness therapy and allows users to unplug, reset and recharge the mind, body and soul. This business emerged from Matt's use of sensory deprivation to treat PTSD. Enlyten Lab plans to offer their services to Missoula's 10,000 veterans and their spouses free-of-charge, in an effort to treat the unseen injuries of war that claim as many as 20 lives per day.

After graduating from high school, Heidi joined the Air Force, served 22 years, retired as a Senior Non Commissioned Officer in 2013 and moved back to Great Falls, Montana where she had been stationed two times during her career and met her husband Thad Reiste. They decided in May 2014 to buy an existing business and fulfill their dreams of owning a small business, providing jobs for Great Falls, and bringing back the downtown coffee shop known as Electric City Coffee.


Willie Blazer
